# Travel advisories correct as at 16.00 16 March 2020

#### **Australia**

Advising against all but essential travel out of Australia. All inbound travellers to Australia have to self-isolate for 14 days

#### **Brazil**

Brazil has not yet issued a statement on outbound travel.

#### Canada

Travel advisory from the government is to avoid all non-essential outbound travel.

#### China

Travel ban is still in place no outbound travel.

# **Denmark**

The Danish Government is advising against all outbound travel.

#### France

Advising against all non-essential outbound travel, travel should be postponed where possible.

## **GCC**

UAE, Kuwait and Saudi Arabia have all advised citizens and residents to avoid travelling abroad. UAE, Kuwait and Saudi Arabia have all closed their borders to non-citizens.

## Germany

German government advising against all non-essential travel. Germany has closed its borders with France, Luxembourg, Denmark, Switzerland and Austria to all but essential travellers with effect from 8am CET Monday 16 March.

#### India

Indian Government has advised against all but essential travel – no tourism related travel should be taken.

### Italy

No travel is permitted in Italy at the moment.

### Japan

Japanese Government is recommending all citizens defer all travel where possible.

# **Netherlands**

Travel advice against affected areas not against UK at the moment.

### Norway

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs advises against travel that is not strictly necessary for all countries. In the first instance, the Travel Council applies from 14 March to 14 April.

### Russia

The Russian authorities have recommended to the Russian public "to avoid international travel" unless it is essential.

# **Spain**

The Spanish government is recommending not to travel anywhere unless necessary.

## Sweden

The Swedish Government has advised against all non-essential outbound travel

### USA

The US State Department has issued a **Global Level 3 Health Advisory – Reconsider Travel.** This advises US citizens to reconsider all travel abroad due to the global impact of COVID-19.
